HORSE & COW PUB & GRILL— A 70-YEAR LEGACY

The name *Horse and Cow* has mythological roots. Neptune, god of the sea, was often depicted with a small horse and a small cow (or bull). During World Wars I and II, merchant sailors—fearful of being sunk by submarines—tattooed a horse on one ankle and a cow on the other, believing it would ensure safe passage.

Founded in 1953, by Jimmy Looby—the legendary "Godfather" of the Submarine Force—Horse and Cow was dedicated to serving submarine sailors and quickly became known as a home away from home. The wild antics of the "Silent Service" crews who passed through became notorious throughout the Submarine Force and the U.S. Navy.

Today, the Horse and Cow Pub & Grill has evolved into a family-friendly restaurant while still honoring its deep naval roots. It proudly features one of the largest private collections of submarine memorabilia, spanning from WWII to the present day. With locations near submarine bases in Bremerton, WA, and St. Mary's, Georgia; the legacy continues.

While times may change, their dedication to the Submarine Force remains unwavering. Visit the St. Mary's location (143 City Smitty Dr, St Marys, GA 31558)—where you'll experience the rich history, warm hospitality, and enduring spirit of the Submarine Force.
